Section One

What is MAPE?

* MAPE (Micros and Primary Education) is a national organisation which aims to promote and develop the awareness and effective use of microelectronics as an integral part of the philosophy and practice of primary education.

Who can join?

* Any person or establishment with an interest in furthering this aim, such as teachers, parents or publishers, both in Britain and overseas.

What does MAPE do?

Offers advice and support through regional committees;

* produces a house journal, MICRO-SCOPE, three times a year;

* produces a number of MICRO-SCOPE Specials;

* runs day conferences and evening meetings in regions;

* holds an Annual Conference each Spring;

* represents the interests of primary education to various national bodies through its National Council.

What are the benefits of membership?

Members receive:

three editions of MICRO-SCOPE, the house journal annually;

* MAPE software - collections of programs for BBC and RML micros. Four collections have been produced during the last four years;

* MICRO-SCOPE Specials - which focus on one particular area of the curriculum or one specific application of technology, or link to a specific theme;

 opportunities to join in a variety of regional activities such as day conferences and evening meetings;

* a cheap insurance scheme for hardware;

* a preferential rate for the Annual Conference;

* advice and support through a team of regional representatives.

Established in 1981, MAPE has the support of government agencies and industrial concerns.

MAPE is a registered charity. It is non profit making and run entirely by unpaid volunteers. Tax relief can be claimed by quoting T1644/23/1986/MT.



MAPE Insurance Scheme

For some years MAPE has run an insurance scheme for members resident in the U.K. When, last year, our insurers greatly increased their rates we decided to make alternative arrangements.
